

RESTORING TRANSPORTATION BALANCE

Restoring Transportation Balance is a San Francisco ballot measure for the November 4, 2014 election.

RTB will foster a dialogue with the Mayor, Board of Supervisors and MTA Board about the needs and concerns of San Francisco residents, employees, businesses and visitors who rely on automobiles. 79% of SF households have cars. Most San Franciscans don't use a single transportation mode - sometimes they drive, sometimes take Muni, sometimes bike and sometimes walk. In recent years MTA policy has ignored this, swinging too far in one direction.

RTP calls for:

- **Restoring free parking at meters on Sundays, holidays and evenings.**
- **Freezing parking meter, parking tickets/fines and City garage rates for five years.**
- **New parking meters and variable metered pricing would be introduced where they do not currently exist only upon the petition by a majority of the neighborhood's residents and merchants.**
- **Motorists should be represented on the MTA Board and citizen advisory committees, because MTA has authority over street design and use, not only public transportation.**
- **Equal enforcement of traffic laws.**
